The Bachelor of Commerce is a flexible three-year degree.

- The degree requires a minimum total of 360 points.
- At least 255 points must be from Commerce course (up to 60 points of Mathematics and/or Statistics at 100 or 200 - level may be included in the 255 points).
- The remaining 105 points can be from Commerce courses or courses from other degrees.
- At least 255 points must be from courses above 100 - level, with at least 90 points at 300 - level.

A minimum of 105 points needs to be completed in your first year to finish your BCom within three years. Most students will take 120 points in their first year.

All UC courses have a point value of 15 or a multiple thereof.

Entry Criteria

1. Must be 18 years or over
2. Must meet NZ Immigration requirements
3. Must have a minimum of IELTS 5.5 in English language or have passed the NZCB entry test.
4. Must have obtained a NZCB L4 Certificate in Business Administration (or its equivalent).
